



## *Trusting God is Knows Best*

<p><i>Day 1</i></p> <p><b>Read Revelation 22:13</b></p> <p>God is eternal, without beginning or end. Yet He tells us He is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end, using the first and last letters of the Hebrew alphabet.</p> <p>What does He reveal about Himself through this name?</p> <p>God is timeless. He is not bound by past, present, future. He created time when He created the world. And just as He exists outside creation, He also lives outside time.</p> <p>To His creatures, He is the Creator of each one's beginning, end, and everything in between. But, He is not limited by time.</p> <p>Consider what this means when it comes to His knowledge?</p> <p>Is there anything He can't see? Does He ever deal with unknowns?</p> <p>Outside time, He sees everything. No matter what choice we make or if we change our mind, He sees the outcome more clearly than we see everything before us in this present moment.</p> <p>Is this a reason to trust Him to guide your everyday decisions? Why or why not?</p>	<p><i>Day 4</i></p> <p><b>Read Matthew 26:36-39</b></p> <p>Sometimes God calls us to painful things. Things we don't want to do. Sacrifices we don't want to make.</p> <p>Jesus experienced the same thing. The same temptation to look for another way. He prayed this prayer in anticipation of His crucifixion.</p> <p>What did He do? Who did He trust?</p> <p>What good came out of Jesus trusting His Father?</p> <p>As followers of Jesus, what should we do?</p> <p>Because God sees the beginning from the end, He knows what will be accomplished by what He calls us to do.</p> <p>Have you heard His call to do something painful?</p> <p>Did you obey?</p> <p>What was the outcome?</p>
<p><i>Day 2</i></p> <p><b>Read Isaiah 42:16</b></p> <p>Isaiah is sharing God's message to His people. What is it He will do for the blind?</p> <p>What kind of blindness do you think He is talking about?</p> <p>Do you consider yourself blind?</p> <p>Yesterday, we considered God's unlimited vision. Compared to Him we are all blind. We cannot see what is coming or what our decisions will lead to or how they will affect other people.</p> <p>If we have access to the One who knows all things, sees all things, why do we continue to base our decisions on our own understanding?</p> <p>How could you begin seeking His guidance and light in your life?</p>	<p><i>Day 5</i></p> <p><b>Read Matthew 5:38-45</b></p> <p>The world has a way it thinks is best and Jesus has a way.</p> <p>How do Jesus's instructions conflict with the world's way?</p> <p>Whose counsel have you taken most often in your life? the world's or Jesus's?</p> <p>Who does Jesus's way call us to be like?</p> <p><b>Read 1Corinthians 1:18-25</b></p> <p>The world deems the cross of Christ foolishness, but it was the wisdom of God for the path of redemption.</p> <p>Re-read these verses. Spend some time meditating on them. Ask God to show You His wisdom and open Your heart to trust He knows best.</p>
<p><i>Day 3</i></p> <p><b>Read Isaiah 50:10-11</b></p> <p>What is light a metaphor for in these verses?</p> <p>What are the two sources of light?</p> <p>What are the different outcomes?</p> <p>What causes people to choose one or the other?</p> <p>Fear of the Lord causes us to choose His light, fear of man and pride cause us to walk in our own light and understanding.</p> <p>Consider whose light you have been walking by in your everyday ordinary life.</p> <p>Respond to Him in prayer.</p>	<p><i>Want to learn more?</i></p> <p><b>Sister Talk: Going Deeper</b> is an extension of <b>Sister Talk: Resuscitate Your Faith</b>.
